



LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I am deeply saddened by the racism and violence that has left our nation reeling again, just when it seems we were finding a new sense of stability coping in a world gripped by a pandemic. The shocking and widely viewed video showing the death of Mr. George Floyd, an unarmed, handcuffed Black man, illustrates yet again that there is still so much to do to end discrimination, injustice, and inequity in our country and in our world.

That inequity is clear when we examine the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. There is no question that people of color are disproportionately affected. Deaths related to COVID-19 are much higher for Black and Hispanic people than those that are white or Asian, according a CDC [study](#). Those outcome differences are attributed to social and economic conditions and it's precisely those factors that also hinder the ability of people to get the resources they need during this public health crisis.

and CT nearly 50 years ago and more recently, MRI, PET neurointerventional radiology, and 3D mammography. Since its beginning, it has expanded its service area to include more than a dozen CHI Franciscan Health and MultiCare Health System hospitals in Pierce and south King Counties, as well as St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton, Oregon.

TRA Medical Imaging has continued providing services during the COVID-19 pandemic and in March designated its Lakewood location to be a site for urgent X-ray and CT exams for COVID-pending symptomatic patients and implementing a "SAFE" approach in all of its locations to ensure staff and public safety:

- S – Social distancing requirements with flexible waiting options
- A – Applied universal masking protocol and temperature screening
- F – Facility safety enhancements including physical and engineered barriers
- E – Enhanced cleaning and disinfecting

TRA Medical Imaging's community commitment is evident in its regular clothing and food drives and the lower fees, payment plans, and financial assistance it provides to patients in need. A recent effort made possible by the TRA Medical Imaging Foundation distributed PPE gift bags to area clinics that were running low on supplies to help keep them open.
