LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Last month, the Alliance, in partnership with the Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA), unveiled the first set of results for the [Washington State Common Measure Set for Health Care Quality and Cost](#), a set of 52 measures that enable a common way of tracking important elements of health and how well the health care system is performing. Measuring the performance of our health care system is an important step toward identifying where it can be improved, but the HCA is taking the Common Measure Set to the next level, by incorporating 19 of the measures into [UMP-Plus](#), a new benefit option for Washington State public employees in the Puget Sound region. Still time to register! Learn how to engage patients through shared decision making

The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), Washington Health Alliance, the Washington State Health Care Authority and Group Health Cooperative are co-sponsoring two free, one-day train-the-trainer workshops on the SHARE approach, a five-step process for shared decision making. The master trainer workshops will train health care leaders who will in turn go back to their organizations and communities to train others in shared decision making. These workshops are the launch of a statewide learning network to support ongoing implementation of shared decision making.
