Labor and Pensions Committee released its long-awaited [bipartisan draft legislation](#) aimed at reducing health care costs. Senate health committee Chairman Lamar Alexander says of the nearly three dozen provisions, “We hope to move it through the health committee in June, put it on the Senate floor in July and make it law.” Ranking Member Senator Patty Murray says, “The steps we are taking on important issue like surprise medical billing, drug prices, maternal mortality, and vaccine hesitancy show we can make progress when both sides are at the table ready to put patients and families first.” Comments on the draft must be sent to LowerHealthCareCosts@help.senate.gov by 5 PM on June 5th.

RAND Corporation Recommends All-Payer Claims Databases to Help Lower Prices

New [hospital pricing research](#) by the RAND Corporation shows large discrepancies between what private health plans pay for hospital services and what Medicare pays. RAND analyzed \$13 billion in hospital spending from 2015 through 2017 in 25 states and found employers pay almost 250% of Medicare rates on average for hospital services, almost 300% for outpatient and 200% for inpatient treatment. RAND recommends that employers:

- exert more pressure on health plans and hospitals to shift away from discounted charge contracts to contracts based on a multiple of Medicare or some other prospective case rate;
- can use networks and benefit designs to move patients away from high-priced, low-value hospitals and health systems;
- encourage price transparency by participating in All-Payer Claims Databases; and
- exert more pressure on their negotiations, including placing limits on out-of-network care payments and using benefit design changes to target high prices.
